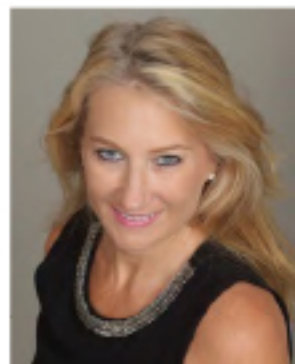

OUR LATEST CHAPTER...

Last summer, JCLF was pleased to turn to a new page in our fundraising efforts – the Legacy Chapter.

The Legacy Chapter is made up of individuals, couples and families that have chosen to place our Foundation in their estate plans. This means that, even after our donors have passed away, they are able to leave a valuable legacy to our nonprofit organization. This also means that JCLF will have funding in future to carry on our mission.

To date, nine individuals have signed a Donor Letter of Intent, and have placed JCLF in their wills. These are the Charter members of JCLF's Legacy Chapter: William Knott, Jeannie Mann, Tami Bandimere, Tom and Alice Atkins, Allison Brigham, Warren Roeske and two anonymous donors.

How can you become a member of the Legacy Chapter? We offer membership to all donors who plan to make an estate gift of any dollar amount to the Jefferson County Library Foundation. Individuals or families who want to be part of our Legacy Chapter are asked to inform us of their plans by filling out a Donor Letter of Intent for our records. Although the donor can alter his or her plans at any time, this gives our organization key information regarding future contributions.

Legacy Chapter contributions can be used in various ways. The monies can help us grow our endowment or dollars may be designated by the donor for specific purposes.

There is also another way to join the Legacy Chapter – through our Giving Circles.

A donation of at least \$5,000 (and up to \$9,999) will qualify you as a member of the Director's Circle. Gifts starting at \$10,000 or more would qualify you as a member of the President's Circle. We are pleased to announce that the Bandimere Family Foundation recently joined the Director's Circle.

Through either level of contribution, donors can choose to dedicate their gift in support of a library program or those dollars can be used to help start a named endowment. With an endowment, once a specific fund reaches a minimum of \$25,000, the donors can name that endowment in honor or in memory of a loved one.

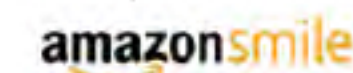

Held on January 25, more than 100 Friends and paying guests — a new attendance milestone — joined us at the Wheat Ridge Recreation Center in Wheat Ridge for an Italian buffet luncheon and to hear Coel's presentation.

"We were so excited to have this popular Colorado

writer in the spotlight at this year's meeting," says Jo Schantz, executive director of JCLF. "Everyone truly enjoyed hearing about Margaret's career, her inspirations and her latest novels. Plus, she grew up right here in Jefferson County!"

Coel is the New York Times best-selling author of the acclaimed Wind River mystery series set

among the Arapahos on Wyoming's Wind River Reservation featuring Jesuit priest Father John O'Malley and Arapaho attorney Vicky Holden. The novels have been on the best seller lists of numerous newspapers, including the New York Times, the Los Angeles Times, The Denver Post and the Rocky Mountain News. Five of her novels have received the Colorado Book Award. *The Spirit Woman* received the Willa Cather Award for Best Novel of the West and was a finalist for the Western Writers of America's Spur Award for Best Novel.

At the event, Coel's husband, George, also came armed with many of his wife's books, which were available for purchase and for the author's signature.

SUMMER READING 2019



Each year, Jefferson County Public Library (JCPL) hosts a county-wide reading challenge called Summer Reading.

This is a true call to action for adults, children and teens to keep families reading throughout the summer months.

Why is this important? Studies show that students who don't read during the annual summer break often fall victim to something known as the "summer slide." That is where children and teens lose their reading skills and fall behind in literacy when they don't keep reading during summer vacation. In this program, parents and other adults serve as "reading models" for children, encouraging youngsters and young adults to read all summer long.

This year's Summer Reading program theme is Mission to Read, and the challenge will take place from June 1 through July 31. During that time frame, participants can earn valuable prizes as they keep reading and reach reading milestones all along the way. Prizes include tickets to local amusement parks, valuable coupons to area restaurants and books.

JCLF is also offering a special incentive for this year for adults who sign up for Summer Reading. Each new participant will receive a \$3-off coupon that can be used for purchases at both the spring and fall Whale of a Used Book Sale!

Last year, nearly 45,000 Jeffco residents read over 49 million cumulative minutes! In 2019, the goal is for participants to read a total of 50 million minutes.

"Our Foundation has been glad to support Summer Reading for many years," says Jo Schantz, JCLF executive director. "We hear so many great comments about the program, and this is a wonderful way to keep hundreds of children reading and learning all year long."

The sale will actually begin on Thursday, May 30, with our Friends-only Preview Night from 6 - 8 p.m. If you aren't yet a Friend of the Library, you can sign up that night and join other Friends in being the first to buy books from our huge sales inventory!

Besides gathering up sale items, we are also in the process of rounding up hundreds of volunteers who can assist us. We need: help with sale set-up, cashiers, greeters, table tidiers, and volunteer check-in, along with kitchen helpers who oversee the snacks and refreshments that we provide for our volunteers.

We are also in great need of some strong men (and women!) to help lift boxes of books at small volume

reserve and large volume reserve stations during the sale, plus we need sturdy individuals who can assist large volume book buyers in carting purchases to their vehicles.

Please know that our volunteers receive great bonuses! In return for their help, each volunteer receives free breakfasts and lunches during event set-up, lots of no-cost snacks at our volunteer kitchen, plus free lunches from our concessionaires during the sale. In addition, volunteers can earn two free books for every four-hour shift they work!

Looking for good books, but don't want to pay for brand new? Then turn to the Jeffco Friends online bookstore!

You'll find our virtual storefront on eBay and Amazon, and both venues offer a wide array of used books, ranging from mystery and biography to history and contemporary fiction. Currently, we are selling books by popular authors such as Suzanne Collins (The Hunger Games), Diana Gabaldon (the Outlander series), adventure novelist Clive Cussler and the classic Western writer, Zane Grey.

"Our Foundation helps recirculate books, CDs and DVDs that our local libraries no longer need," explains Don DuBé, JCLF's warehouse coordinator. "In addition, we receive some very unusual contributions from individuals who live throughout Jeffco, which makes our work exciting – you never know what you'll find in our day-to-day donations."

To emphasize this last comment, Don points to one outstanding donated book that we sold via auction on eBay. The book was an original edition, published in France in 1956, titled: *Illustrations for the Bible*, and the author was world-renowned artist Marc Chagall. The starting price was \$399, and the bidding war continued for 10 days. After more than 30 ever-increasing offers, the book finally sold for \$1,708!

Monies raised from these online book sales, along with our physical used book sales, help JCLF fund various library programs, including the annual Summer Reading challenge and Early Childhood Literacy.

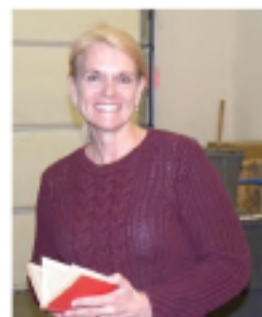


Don DuBé, JCLF Warehouse Coordinator
