Even though there is a pandemic going on, that hasn't slowed down book donations at our Foundation warehouse in Wheat Ridge. We accept contributions on Mondays and Tuesdays only, because we quarantine all books and media donations in a POD in our parking lot. And by each Tuesday afternoon, the POD is jam packed with donations!

If you have books, CDs, DVDs and/or vinyl records to donate, contribution hours are 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each Monday and Tuesday (except for national holidays), and we can accept up to six boxes of books at a time per donor. We do not accept magazines, VHS tapes, cassettes or encyclopedias.

# Director's Notes



I think everyone has been glad to say good-bye to the year 2020. Now, as we move into 2021, things are looking brighter as we can see the light at the end of the COVID-19 pandemic tunnel.

Our Foundation was fortunate to remain operational throughout the year, even though our offices closed on March 15, 2020, and then slowly reopened for staff and volunteers by the end of last

June. Even now, we remain diligent in following all the best health and safety protocols in an effort to keep everyone safe, including our donors and volunteers!

With that same safety in mind, JCLF did manage to operate our fall Whale of a Used Book Sale at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds last October. We expanded the days and hours of the sale, we enforced a reservation system, we charged an admission fee of \$5 per person and only 50 shoppers were allowed in the exhibit halls at any one time. That said, we generated more than \$45,000 from that sale, which was a big boost to our 2020 budget.

Our Foundation also was successful in opening up a new bookstore during the pandemic, which not only brought in much-needed funds, but also helped us expand our visibility here in Jefferson County. You can read more about our storefront, Whale's Tale Books & Gifts, on pages 6 and 7 of this newsletter.

At the same time, we were busily applying for local and state grants, most made available via COVID relief funds. We were grateful to receive sizeable contributions from the Jeffco HOPE fund, the Jeffco CARES Act, and the Jefferson County CARES Act Non-Profit Grant Award Program. Our Foundation also received loans from the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and the Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) Program. Earlier this year, we received a special grant from Community First Foundation that we dispersed to 21 JCPL staff members to assist with childcare costs due to the pandemic.

These monies have helped us continue on with our important mission – that of providing fundraising support and advocacy for Jefferson County Public Library.

Above all, I appreciate our loyal donors who have not only contributed to JCLF through our end-of-year appeal, Giving Tuesday and Colorado Gives Day, but also to those who have renewed or become new members of our Friends of the Library organization. Thank you so much for your support!

#### W. MICHAEL GEAR AND KATHLEEN O'NEAL GEAR HEADLINE "AUTHORS IN THE AFTERNOON" AUGUST 27

"Authors in the Afternoon," JCLF's new author presentation and fundraising series, has moved to a new date – Friday, August 27, 2021, 4 to 5:30 p.m. in the Monarch Room at the Denver Marriott West in Golden. This event was originally slated for last November, however due to an uptick in Jeffco's COVID-19 cases, the event had to be postponed.

Right now, we are on target to welcome our featured guests **W. Michael Gear and Kathleen O'Neal Gear,** a popular literary duo from Thermopolis, Wyoming, who will be sharing more about their prolific writing careers and their multiple series of books.

Michael Gear has published nearly two dozen novels under his own name, and he has authored another 37 with Kathleen. His recently released books include: *Unreconciled, Flight of the Hawk: The Plains, Pariah, Star Path*, and his latest sci-fi mystery, *Alpha Enigma*, debuted last year.

Kathleen O'Neal Gear has over 200 non-fiction publications in the fields of archaeology, history, and bison conservation, and she has authored or co-authored 47 international bestsellers. Kathleen's most recent books include *Cries from the Lost Island, Maze Master* and *People of the Canyons*, which she co-wrote with her husband. Her latest novel, *Ice Lion*, is the first book in her new cli-fi trilogy.

The luncheon event will be held on Friday, July 16, from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., at the Wheat Ridge Recreation Center in Wheat Ridge, CO.

Renowned for her spine-tingling suspense novels, Nickless has been hailed by bestselling crime writer Jeffery Deaver as "a natural storyteller." Nickless' first book, *Blood on the Tracks*, was praised by authors and critics as "beautifully written and heartbreakingly intense," a "bullet train of action," and "a first-class read." Her "blisteringly original" Sydney Rose Parnell crime novels – featuring a railway cop and her K9 partner – also include *Dead Stop, Ambush* and *Gone to Darkness*.

Nickless, who hails from Colorado Springs, has won two Colorado Book Awards and the prestigious Daphne du Maurier Award of Excellence, plus she was a Suspense Magazine "Best of 2016" selection. The author will provide a presentation at the luncheon and will answer audience questions. Her popular novels will be available for signing and for sale at the event.

The presentation and luncheon are open to the public, as well as to all Friends of the Library. Tickets are \$35 for Friends members, \$45 for non-members or \$50 for new and renewing Friends members (which includes a 12-month Friends membership). # Our 2020 Fall Whale Sale Netted a Big Bounty!

Our staff and volunteers were brimming with excitement when JCLF was able to host last year's fall Whale of a Used Book Sale, especially after we had to forgo our spring 2020 sale due to COVID-19. The fall sale was held from Wednesday evening, October 14, through Sunday, October 18, at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds in Golden. Nearly 1,700 individuals attended this five-day book lovers' bonanza, which started off with our traditional Friends Preview Night and concluded with JCLF's popular Bag Day, where patrons could purchase a bag of books and other media for just \$8.

Our fall sale looked very different from previous Whale Sales, due to the coronavirus pandemic. JCLF had to implement the 50-shoppers-at-a-time rule to comply with our county's health and safety mandates that limited in-person attendance at indoor events, plus we enforced social distancing and the wearing of face coverings for staff, volunteers and shoppers alike.

For the first time in our Whale Sale history, JCLF also implemented a pre-paid reservation system, and many of our patrons paid \$5 for each of their shopping hours. As a bonus, shoppers with reservations received a free book, CD or DVD for each hour they reserved. Walk-ins were welcome with no reservation fee, and these individuals were allowed to join the sale when space became available in the exhibit halls.

Above all, everyone was just very glad that JCLF was able to produce this event – despite the pandemic!

More than 100 volunteers helped us manage the fall sale, which was overseen by our event planner, Deborah Deal, vice president of JCLF's Board of Directors. We were also grateful that these Foundation Board members participated

# Our new bookstore – Whale's Tale Books & Gifts

Last November, on Black Friday (November 27), our Foundation launched a new fundraising endeavor – our Whale's Tale Books & Gifts shop located at Colorado Mills Mall in Lakewood.

"We needed a location for our holiday book sales, so we signed a short-term, six-week lease on Unit 527, which is located next door to Dick's Sporting Goods," comments Jo Schantz, JCLF's executive director. "The storefront was formerly a shoe store, and all the shelves and equipment were already in place. It was a perfect site for us to test the retail market by opening up a used bookstore operation. We also took a huge leap of faith to open up a business during the COVID-19 pandemic."

But that leap has paid off in huge dollar dividends. During that brief trial period, the Foundation raised more than \$28,000. That's when JCLF's Board of Directors decided to extend the lease, and the Foundation recently signed a contract that will keep us at the Mall through February 2022.

Even more amazingly, the storefront has continued to generate impressive revenues, even weeks after the winter holidays. In January, gross sales reached \$12,251, they reached \$12,600 in February, and March topped more than \$12,800 in income.



While Whale's Tale has given us a new outlet and greater visibility for selling our used books, we are also finding a broader market for our used CDs, DVDs and especially our vinyl records. JCLF also sells new gift items, such as greeting cards, scarves, handbags, jewelry, stuffed animals, and

themed gift baskets. The latter items are cleverly created by volunteers Mickey Lytle and Sandy Kramer, who designed nearly 100 gift baskets for our winter holiday sales.

Whale's Tale Books & Gifts is staffed by dedicated volunteers who are recruited, trained and scheduled by the Foundation's Volunteer & Friends Coordinator Kirstin Kraig, who also manages the storefront operation.



# **Volunteers Needed!**

Our new Whale's Tale Books & Gifts shop is open seven days a week and we always need volunteers to help us. One of our volunteer crews comes from a local book club. Their members rotate through one shift a week at our storefront operation, and each week the store is staffed by a different book club member.

### JCLF Distributes \$22,600 to JCPL Staff for Cash Assistance with Child Care

Our Foundation is happy to announce that 21 Library staff members received cash awards to assist with added childcare costs as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Award Letters were sent out to these JCPL employees the first week in March, and the checks were distributed the following week.

"We were so pleased to be able to help hardworking Library employees with these unexpected expenses that resulted from coronavirus," said JCLF Board Treasurer Ron Benson. "And, we are especially grateful to Community First Foundation for the grant that made this possible."

Applications were judged by a panel of Foundation Board members, who awarded cash gifts ranging from \$400 to \$1,500 for each of these eligible Library workers. All told, the Foundation distributed \$22,600 to JCPL employees. This assistance carried no expectation of any benefit to the Foundation by the employee or the Library.

our Foundation to be part of this distribution process.

#### Library Summer Challenge Starts June 1

For more than a decade, Jefferson County Public Library (JCPL) has produced its popular summer reading and learning program, and the year 2021 will carry on that legacy and the challenge to Jeffco readers. This



year, JCPL is tagging the free event as the Library Summer Challenge with a theme of "Wild Ideas." The intention is to have more than 30,000 Jeffco residents – ranging from babies to seniors – engaged in the eight-week program.

"Our Foundation has always been glad to help fund the Library's annual summer reading challenge," says JCLF Board President Ana Rojas-Artica. "This year, we have committed to providing \$30,000 in support of this essential literacy and learning program."

The Library Summer Challenge is vitally important because it helps keep children and teens engaged in reading and learning throughout the summer without losing their level of reading skills, something known in academic circles as "summer slide." The program also enlists parents and other adults to serve as "reading and learning role models" for younger readers. That way, students can maintain those key literacy and learning skills when it's time to return to school in the fall.

With an eye to keeping participants safe from COVID-19, JCPL staff has come up with a check list of activities that readers can accomplish on their own or with their families, and without meeting as part of a group. For example, children ages three to 11 years old can: create their own science experiment; tell the story of their day through video, photos or drawings; or make a list of wildlife they see in their own backyard. For teenagers, activities include: attending a live music concert online; learning a new language using JCPL's free Mango program; or virtually visiting famous museums such as Rome's La Galleria Nazionale.

Last year, program participants gave high praise to JCPL's summer reading challenge:
