Letter from JCLF Board President



Welcome to the Jefferson County Library Foundation's 2024 Annual Report!

For nearly 60 years, JCLF has been dedicated to our special mission – that of providing fundraising support and advocacy for Jefferson County Public Library (JCPL). In 2024, we contributed over \$192,000 to JCPL to help fund programs, events and activities such as:

- ▶ **Library Summer Challenge**
- ▶ **Culture Passes**
- ▶ **1000 Books Before Kindergarten**
- ▶ **Raise A Reader**
- ▶ **Cold/hot weather supplies and bus passes for Library patrons**

And that's not all! In 2024, our Foundation was able to secure nearly \$80,000 in naming rights for the JCPL branch locations in Evergreen and Conifer.

Our Foundation raises monies in multiple ways – via our semi-annual **Whale of a Used Book Sales**, a year-round grants initiative, online and in-library book sales, book sales to outside vendors, annual giving campaigns (our annual appeal, Colorado Gives Day, Giving Tuesday and Library Giving Day), corporate sponsorships, ticketed special events, bequests, memorial contributions, naming opportunities and major gifts.

One of our most successful revenue sources is our **Whale's Tale Books & Gifts shop in Colorado Mills Mall**. In 2024, **Whale's Tale generated nearly \$130,000 in sales** of gently used books, media materials plus new items, such as greeting cards, journals, jewelry, scented candles, scarves, Honeyville products, and more!

We are also proud that, in 2024, JCLF hosted **two Whale of a Used Book Sales** at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds in Golden. Together **these events raised over \$159,000 in gross sales**.

That same year, we produced many other fundraising events, featuring: **Dine & Donate at 240 Union Creative Grille**, our **3rd annual Books On Film benefit**, a **Barnes & Noble Bookfair**, and our popular **shred-a-thon held at the Bank of Colorado in Lakewood**.

In light of all the year's successes, I want to applaud everyone who has helped in these efforts – JCLF's governing Board, our dedicated staff, entire teams of valiant Foundation volunteers, our Friends of the Library membership organization, multiple event sponsors and foundation supporters along with many generous individual donors.

I'm grateful for all you do to help us in our mission.

Our 2024 Supported Programs

Library Summer Challenge

We consider our support of the *Library Summer Challenge* as one of the most important ways in which we impact our community.

In 2024, this summertime program had robust participation, and its effects have the potential for far-reaching transformation for its participants.

Over 28,000 participants, including 13,649 3-11 year-old children and nearly 8,000 adults, registered for the event.



Key Outcomes: Preventing the Summer Slide and Closing Opportunity Gaps

The “Summer Slide” is a well-documented phenomenon: children can lose some of the academic skills they develop during the school year over the long summer break, and these losses accumulate over time. **The Library Summer Challenge provides students—and their families—with fun, engaging ways to continue learning, nurturing curiosity, and strengthening skills even outside the classroom.**

The program achieves these goals in a number of ways:

- It encourages families to read together—children who see adults reading tend to become active readers themselves. And active reading over the summer improves reading skills!
- Mental engagement and socialization are important for people of all ages, and both improve mental well-being and brain health.
- It helps participants develop a love of lifelong learning.

Opportunity gaps can limit children’s access to enriching experiences such as summer camps, which provide both social interaction and learning opportunities, but which can be costly. The Library Summer Challenge offers

free, engaging alternatives that deliver the same benefits, with innovative options like Drone Camp, Magic Mania, Culinary Camp, and the Mobile Earth Science Observatory Camp.

Through the Library Summer Challenge, we’re proud to support a summer filled with curiosity, growth, and joy for thousands of community members, helping to ensure that learning—and the excitement of discovery—never takes a break.

Each year our Foundation makes a \$500 contribution to Jeffco Library Gives, which is then awarded to a local charity once a community reading goal is met.

The 2024 Jeffco Library Gives winner was **Outdoor Lab.**



Additionally, the Foundation gives \$800 awards to one school in each of five categories that have improved their previous year reading participation via a drawing.

Early Childhood Literacy

1000 Books Before Kindergarten

Giving families the tools and motivation to ensure that their children are “reading-ready” for kindergarten and beyond—that is what this foundational early literacy program at JCPL is all about!



1000 Books Before Kindergarten is a nationwide initiative that promotes early childhood literacy in a family-friendly, interactive way.

Children receive prizes as they reach specific reading and learning milestones, and the program relies on families to embrace their roles as their children’s first teachers!

Parents are encouraged to read to their children and attend programs such as Story Time, Baby/Toddler Time, Discovery Time at the library and online, to use the library’s online reading resources, such as Tumble Books, and to engage in tracking and discussing with their children books that were read at child care centers and in preschools.

Babies First Books

When should you start reading to your baby? The answer is it is that it’s never too early to start.

This initiative gets books into the hands of new parents and caregivers and acts as a framework to help them learn about the benefits of reading to their newborn!



Free books are available at each Library branch that encourage families to read together! Patrons can receive a copy of Rock-A-Bye reader in English or Spanish.

These high-quality books contain rhymes and songs along with tips and information for adult readers on how these activities positively affect their baby’s brain development.



Raise A Reader

The 2024 Raise a Reader Festival, held on September 28, 2025 at the Colorado Railroad Museum, was a huge success, drawing over

1,600 participants for a day full of fun, learning, and community connection! Families explored train rides, creative art stations, lively music and dancing, bubble-making, storytelling, and countless opportunities to meet neighbors and make new friends.



Now in its fifth year, the festival has quickly become one of the Library’s most anticipated and well-attended community events.

More than just a day of entertainment, the festival introduces parents and caregivers to the wealth of programs and resources available through Jefferson County Public Library, helping families build strong literacy foundations and lifelong learning habits.



Our Foundation was proud to support this vibrant, community-focused event in 2024 that celebrates the joy, curiosity, and connection that Raise a Reader inspires in families across our county!



Shred-A-Thon

We were thrilled to host our annual **Shred-A-Thon** again this year at **Bank of Colorado** in Lakewood on August 17.

"We are pleased to see the turnout increase year over year for this fundraising event. Not only does it help us raise funds for the Library's children's literacy programs that are so important for Jeffco families, it also provides a community service at a great price point," commented JCLF Executive Director Jo Schantz Hall.

Customers paid \$20 per carload for shredding of their sensitive documents by Shred-it and the event produced total income of **\$3,389**.





USED BOOK SALES

Whale of a Used Book Sales

The semi-annual spring and fall Whale of a Used Book Sales are much-anticipated community events and our largest fundraisers, and 2024 saw a return to pre-COVID attendance levels.

Over 6,000 booklovers found their treasures as they browsed through 180,000 gently used books, media, antique/collectible items, gift baskets, puzzles, and games, most priced from \$0.50 to \$3 apiece! In keeping with our mission of expanding and providing access to all residents, we waived the admission fee of \$5/adult for SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) families again this year, because providing access to affordable books and media for all ages (children, tween/teen and adult) helps support and promote a thriving, literate, and engaged community of readers!

This year, we partnered with Colorado State University Extension in Jefferson County (CSUE) and the Fairgrounds to enhance the final day of our sale with engaging and enriching activities for

children and families with Fall Family Fun Day.

Attendees participated in an afternoon of fall-themed STEM activities, outdoor education, candy collecting, and prize giveaways.



JeffcoFriends Online Bookstore

We love finding new homes for used books—both from a sustainability perspective and from knowing that there are certain books that booklovers crave! Our online bookstore caters to the booklover who is searching for that special book—typically collectible, early edition, out-of-print or that has sentimental value.

Our JeffcoFriends Amazon and eBay platforms offer an eclectic collection of hard-to-find and collectible books that we ship worldwide.

Speaking of Sustainability...

Success can be measured in more ways than one, and one of the ways that we contribute to the community is by getting books into hands and therefore keeping them out of landfills and incinerators.

We receive donations from both the Library and the public. While we sell most of these books at our Whale of a Used Book Sales, Whale's Tale Bookstore, and online JeffcoFriends bookstore, some books and items don't sell. That is where our partnership with **Dream Books Co** and charitable organizations comes into play.

Dream Books Co purchases books that we cannot sell or donate through our charitable and sales channels and sells them through their extensive network of booksellers and online platforms. Any books they don't sell are recycled.

Through our partnership with Dream Books Co, our online and Whale Sales, Whale's Tale



bookstore, and donations to hospitals, prisons, shelters, and other nonprofit organizations, **we keep over 38 tons of donated and ex-library books out of landfills each year.**

Colorado Gives Day and Library Giving Week

Colorado Gives Day and Library Giving Week are our two annual online fundraisers.



Despite its name, **Colorado Gives Day** now extends well beyond one day. In 2024, the giving period ran from November 1 through December 10, giving supporters plenty of time to make a difference. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we're thrilled to share that the 2024 campaign brought in more than **\$30,100** for our Foundation — funds that will help us continue our mission and strengthen the communities we serve.

Library Giving Day started as the brainchild of Seattle Public Library. Like its sister, Colorado Gives Day, it also has morphed over the years into a longer campaign—now one full week that runs concurrently with National Library Week. In 2024, Library Giving Week netted over **\$7,500** for our cause.

The Evergreen Library Redesign Project

We're delighted to share that the Evergreen Library redesign project is now complete.




